Position Overview

The Teacher of Design and Technology is responsible for delivering high-quality Design and Technology (DT) education to students across Key Stage 3, 4 and Key Stage 5, including the teaching of GCSE and A level. This role is essential for enhancing teaching and learning within our Design and Technology department, fostering a positive learning environment that enables students to achieve their academic potential.

Key Responsibilities

- Plan and deliver engaging DT lessons that cater to diverse learning needs across Key Stage 3,4 and 5.
- Assess and evaluate student progress through formative and summative assessments, providing timely feedback.
- Teach all aspects of the DT curriculum, ensuring comprehensive coverage of required content.

Student Support and Engagement

- Provide additional support to students who require assistance in understanding design concepts, including differentiated instruction.
- Foster a positive classroom environment that encourages student participation and enthusiasm for DT.

Collaboration and Communication

- Work collaboratively with other teachers and staff to support departmental and whole school initiatives, and share best practices in line with the Academy’s teaching and learning policy.
- Communicate effectively with parents regarding student progress, achievements, and any concerns, maintaining strong home-school links.

Professional Development

- Engage in continuous professional development to enhance teaching practices and stay updated with educational trends, including attending relevant training sessions and workshops.

- Deliver a comprehensive DT curriculum that meets the needs of all students, ensuring effective teaching of Key Stage 3, 4 and 5 content.
- Achieve measurable improvements in student performance in DT assessments, with a focus on GCSE and A level outcomes.
- Create a supportive and inclusive classroom environment that promotes student confidence and engagement in DT.
- Foster positive relationships with students, parents, and colleagues to enhance the overall educational experience.
- Implement effective classroom management strategies to maintain a conducive learning environment.
- Contribute to the school's overall objectives and improvement plans.
