#### **Medication in School**

A reminder to all parents should your child have a medical condition that requires him/her to be medicated during school hours:-

- Medication <u>must</u> be brought to school by a Parent or Carer. Please note - we cannot accept medication of any type directly from the student.
- Parents/Carers are required to sign a Parental Agreement Form prior to the medication being administered to their child.
- We <u>are able to accept</u> medication, prescribed by

- your GP, in the box that it was dispensed with the pharmacy label, child's name, dosage regime, date it was dispensed and the expiry date.
- Please Note: we are <u>unable to accept</u> shop-bought or over the counter medication.
- If your child is on a short course of antibiotics, three times a day, please note that it is acceptable to give your child a tablet in the morning, teatime (when they get home from school) and bedtime. In other words, such medication can be wholly administered at home.

Should you need to sign in medication, or for any further information, please contact Ms Mizen on extension 206.



#### **Attendance**

Parents are reminded of the Government Threshold for what is termed a 'Persistent Absentee'. This is now defined as any student with an attendance record of less than 90%. We encourage parents to keep a regular check on their child's attendance levels and, of course, if you have any concerns, our staff are available at any time for a consultation.



# Lunchtime Arrangements • Parents will be aware that our older

- Parents will be aware that our older students in Years 10, 11, 12 and 13 have the choice of remaining in school or taking lunch elsewhere. Some do remain on site but the vast majority do leave the school premises.
- The situation is different for our younger students in Years 7, 8 and
   With safety in mind, they should remain on the school premises for the whole lunch break. Students in Years 7, 8 and 9 have a choice of lunch, either a hot meal or to bring their own packed
- lunch. The only exception to this rule should be that they go home for lunch, where they will be supervised by a parent or other responsible adult. In September, school will issue a letter to parents about this process, asking for verification of any request to leave the premises at lunchtime.
- We ask all parents to reinforce this message to their children and be aware of where they go for lunch.
- We operate a cashless system
   of paying for lunches. It is the
   responsibility of parents and students
   to ensure that there is enough money
   in the account to pay for the meal. The
   school will contact parents if accounts
   go into arrears.

#### Traffic at the School Gates

Once again, we would like to pass on our appreciation to all parents who have responded to our request to ease traffic congestion at the school gates before and after school. Each day, over 1600 children enter and leave the school site. We have all seen how congested the area around the school gates can become at around 8.30am and 3.15pm and this could not be managed without the co-operation of drivers.

At those key times, other than the school buses, we now allow entry into the school grounds only for vehicles transporting disabled children. We ask that all other parents pick up and drop off children at a point well away from the school gates to avoid the congestion, which is as much an inconvenience for drivers as pedestrians. Many thanks for your patience and understanding!

#### **School Uniform Trousers**

We are aware that some stores are advertising 'school uniform' trousers that do not match our uniform requirement. As a reminder, please note that:

• Harton school trousers for both boys and girls should be traditional formal black dress trousers. Black denim, leggings or skin tight trousers that resemble jeans should not be worn to school.

We ask that parents please check this carefully before purchase.
